# **1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

# **1.1 INTRODUCTION**

Mrs. Kesharbai Sonajirao Kshirsagar Alias kaku Arts, Science & Commerce College Beed (M.S.) run by Navgan Shikshan Sanstha Rajuri (N) was Established in June 1971 by Hon. Late Kesharbai Sonajirao Kshirsagar Alias kaku (Ex. Member of Parliament) with a noble & foresighted vision to provide higher education to rural youth. The college is affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad. The College is now a fully fledged multi faculty institution.

The college is accredited by NAAC in 2004 and awarded B+ grade with (75.55 score) in first cycle. In second cycle college is reaccredited by NAAC in 2011 and awarded A grade with (CGPA 3.11). In third cycle college is reaccredited as per revised accreditation framework (RAF) in 2018 and got A grade with (CGPA 3.18). These NAAC accreditation results indicates that institute is continuously increases growth and quality in higher education.

This college is co-educational type of institute recognized by UGC under section 2(F) and 12(B). College offers B.A., B. Sc., B. Com and B.Voc. programmes for undergraduate level in which 15 courses in arts faculty, 7 courses in the science faculty, faculty of commerce and B.Voc. in rural health care and sanitation.

The offers 15 Post graduate courses in which 7 from Arts and humanities, 7 from science and technology and 1 from commerce discipline.

College offers Ph.D. programs in Marathi, Hindi, English, Home science, Botany, Zoology, Microbiology and Commerce.

Department of chemistry and physics submitted proposal to university for recognition of research center.

#### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

The Institute has formulated "Research Development Cell" to promote research climate in institution. Microbiology, Botany, Zoology, Home Science, English, Hindi, Marathi and Commerce departments are Recognized Research Centers by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagr. Chemistry and Physics Research centres recognition is in progress.

Faculty members completed six research Projects during last five years and received grant Rs.19, 65,000/from government and nongovernmental funding agencies. Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) granted Rs.2, 000, 00/- for organizing the National Seminar 'Black Money and Its Impact on Indian Economy'.

Institute publishes interdisciplinary research journal 'KESONA REPORT' for faculties to publish their research articles and 'DURVANKUR' annual magazine every year highlighting the ideas of students. The college has adapted and implemented code of ethics to check malpractices and plagiarism in research. The fully automated library is equipped with online learning platforms like INFLIBNET.

One faculty member is granted with one patent. Five faculty members of our institute are ranked in AD Scientific Index Ranking for Scientist list. 21 Faculty members are recognized Ph.D. guides of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University.124 Research scholars are perusing for Ph.D. Degree in eight research centers.53 workshops/seminars/conferences conducted during last five years. Faculty members have published 348 research papers and 111 books, chapters in the books, conference proceedings.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The institution has a clear cut policy for improving the infrastructural facilities which would facilitate teaching learning processes. The college has about 9030.30 sq.mtr. built up area, with 2.27 acres land area. These structures house 47 class rooms, with proper lighting, seating and ventilation, seven technology enabled smart class rooms, a state of the art auditorium with a seating capacity of 500, equipped with modern audio and visual instruments. The college has separate building for library consisting of 99066 books and its first floor is a reading hall for students. The campus houses science laboratories, ICT enabled classrooms, library, NCC and NSS rooms, ladies common rooms, seminar halls, a well constructed auditorium, a conference hall and a canteen. indoor sports hall and Gymnasium, canteen, first aid centre, day care centre, girls rest/recreation room and washrooms.

College has sound system, music system, Acto Pad, Key Board, light system and various allied equipment. The Sports Facilities for students are Badminton Court 02, Table Tennis Tables 01, Weight Lifting Set 01, Power Lifting Set 01, Indoor Hall 01, Wrestling, Athletics

New facilities have been augmented during the past years where several class rooms and laboratories have been added by incurring an expenditure of about Rs.1.07 Crores. The total expenditure towards books and journals in the past four years has been Rs. 1452901 with approximately about 13000 books being added.

ICT resources have been sufficiently strengthened in the institution with Computer to Student ratio being about 1:8. Expenditure incurred on maintenance and renovation works in the college stands at about Rs. 15174824. An PC Care, System Administrator and a technician are appointed for the purpose of maintenance of the building, computers and equipment. An electrician is appointed to supervise the well being of electrical fixtures and electrical connections in the college. The college library has reprographic service and other essential services. ICT learning resources are available in the college.

There is a language laboratory with 18 computers connected in LAN offering communicative skills to students. The computer Science department has Computer labs with 20 computers each connected in LAN with HP Workstations to run the latest multimedia and programming software.

## **Student Support and Progression**

- Student avail scholarship and other financial assistance from the state and central governments. The college also supports the economically weaker students though Earn and learn scheme and waived fees.
- As our college has large number of students from rural areas and sugarcane cutter workers, we try to organize maximum activities for their skill enhancement. Various activities of soft skills, language and communication skills life skills, were conducted for students to develop entrepreneurial skills through career oriented courses, skill development and short term courses.
- The college magazine "Durvankur" and wall papers on different occasions encourage the students to enhance their expressions and creativity skills in social and educational arenas. Skills are also improved through activities like seminars, Avishkar, Poster presentation, Essay competitions ,elocution competitions, good handwriting competitions, Poem reading.
- Students are benefited by guidance for competitive examinations and career counseling through SET/NET guidance center, competitive examination center and placement cell. Students are placed in state government services and private companies
- We try to give priority to girls for their safety, discipline, self defense training, cyber crime, sexual harassment awareness and many awareness activities. The college has transferring mechanism for timely redressed of student grievances through statutory committees like anti sexual harassment cell, grievance redressal cell and anti raging committee.
- Knowing that rural students have more talent for sports and cultural events, college has separate departments for Sports, Drama and Music. We organize maximum activaties to involve students, as a result ranks and medals are bagged by the students in sports and cultural activities
- There is registered Alumni Association named Sau. K. S. K Maji Vidyarthi Sanghatana . The alumni of the college actively involve in various events of the college either as resource persons, judges or facilitators for extra curricular activities

## Governance, Leadership and Management

The governance and leadership are in accordance with the vision and mission of the Institute. Administrative responsibilities are decentralized, Viz- management, principal, two vice- principals, P.G. director, head of the

department, committees like CDC, IQAC etc., staff secretaries, office superintendent, head clerk, accountant etc. Along with this, various committees are formed for smooth administrative functioning. The administration of the college is vested in the hands of the Navgan Shikshan Sanstha Rajuri (N). The democratic structure of organizational governance facilitates everyone to play a pivotal role to attain institution's vision and mission. The administration of the college having number of committees and cells like the IQAC,AISHE/DHE-MIS/NIRF,UGC, College Development Committee, College Building and Construction Committee, Examination Committee, Admission Committee, Purchase Committee, Placement Cell, Library Advisory Committee, Anti-ragging Committee, Staff Welfare Committee, Discipline Committee, Grievances and Redressal cell, Women's cell, Alumni Committee, Feedback Committee. The college has well developed elibrary facility, indoor sport hall, ladies and boys hostel for needy students. The College has designed an E-Governance Policy with the primary objective of implementing e-governance in various operations, transactions and services of the institution for better efficiency, transparency and accountability. This policy shall apply to the Administration, Finance and Accounts, Student Admission and Support and Examination sections of the college. The Institution takes responsibility to take efforts to make the staff happy, healthy and satisfied to maintain a good work culture. The Performance appraisal system is followed for teaching. . The obtained API score is evaluated by the IQAC committee and the collected data is evaluated by the administrative officers of institution. The confidential report of staff is taken by the management at the end of the academic year. Institution provides financial support to attend conferences/workshops for teaching staff. The institute organizes faculty development program and training program for teaching and non-teaching staff. The college maintains finance & accounts systematically. Institution conducts internal & external financial audits regularly. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes. It reviews teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes.

### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

Our college is very proactive in shouldering social responsibilities with regards to the pressing issues like gender equality promotion programs, *divyangjan* facilities, environmental consciousness and sustainability.

The institution has 8 recognized research centers where students are doing their researches under the able guidance of the research supervisor. 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Since the last year, the institution has been following the practice of ABC as per the university guidelines. ## **Planning:**

- College has well furnished ICT rooms, Commerce lab, language lab and well equipped laboratories in science departments.
- Students are provided with the facility of departmental library besides it college central library provides online resources to students with books, journals,e-journals and softwares .
- Teachers take all the efforts to ensure quality and enhance academic growth of the students for monitoring the student progress.
- The test, tutorials, projects, seminars are also conducted.
- Guest lectures and supplementary classes and group discussion are conducted by the teachers.
- Remedial classes are carried out for slow learners and advanced learners are encouraged for cocurricular and extra curricular activities.

Response: - In making learning student-centric, various innovative teaching methods are employed:

### **Experiential learning: -**

Departments like Home Science, Geography, Physical Education, Drama, and Music organize practicaloriented activities. These include group discussions, field visits, debate competitions, quiz competitions, and poster presentations (such as Avishkar and writing articles in the college magazine Durwankur).

### **Participative learning:**

- The English Language Laboratory enhances communication skills.
- The Computer Science Department utilizes computer programming and statistical tools for problem-solving.
- The Sports Department engages students in various sports activities.
- The Drama Department organizes street plays, involving students in performances.
- Study tours, research projects, Science association activities, Science exhibitions, and laboratory practicals are part of this approach.

### **Problem-solving methods:**

Teachers employ problem-solving techniques to foster critical thinking among students. The college has a Student Mentoring Committee, with each faculty member mentoring 30 students. Mentors assist students in problem-solving, including clearing curriculum-related doubts in the classroom. Additionally, on the last Saturday of every month, the college premises host activities to support the poor and needy by providing them with basic necessities. Other initiatives include organizing blood donation camps and providing remedial coaching.

Teachers utilize ICT-enabled tools for an effective teaching-learning process.

- Library facilities: MOPAC software allows students to access books online. The library offers over 6000 e-journals and 31,35000 e-books, as well as CDs/DVDs and e-books.

#### Mechanism of Internal Assessment:

The schedule of tests, tutorials, and projects is communicated to students in advance through the academic calendar and WhatsApp groups. Notices/circulars related to examinations are displayed on the notice boards in each department. Results are displayed on the notice boards, and if any student has grievances, they are resolved within a specific timeframe. Students can approach the concerned teacher to resolve their queries.

#### Transparency:

Students are transparently and regularly evaluated based on internal tests. Faculty discuss problems related to answer papers of internal tests and practical exams, ensuring timely resolution of students' issues.

#### Mechanism of External Assessment:

For university examination assessments, our faculty members go to local D.CAS Senters to assess answer books within the stipulated time as per the guidelines of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Chatrapati Sambhaji Nagar.

#### Time-bound:

The schedule of unit tests is communicated well in advance to faculty and students via WhatsApp groups, and the results are displayed on the respective department notice boards.

#### **Efficiency:**

Mentoring by faculty members includes monitoring students' academic and personal counselling with special provisions made for disabled students such as wheelchair accessibility and seating arrangements on the ground floor. Online tests conducted during the pandemic period were eco-friendly and aligned with the university examination model.

#### **Grievance Redressal System:**

Departments of all faculties preserve exam question papers. Grievances regarding evaluation are addressed as per the rules and regulations of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University. Students can apply for verification of marks, and photocopies of assessed answer books/sheets are made available to students for exam-related grievances.

The grievance redressal cell under the examination department promptly addresses exam-related grievances, giving top priority to avoiding any delays in issue resolution. If the grievance redressal cell receives any complaints regarding internal assessment, the subject teacher and HOD of the concerned department investigate the matter to ensure justice for the affected student.

The college is affiliated with Dr. B.A.M.U Chatrpati Sambhaji Nagar, follows its rules and guidelines regarding student performance assessment and evaluation. This information is communicated to students. Internal assessment is conducted systematically for theory and practical subjects, with an academic calendar prepared at the beginning of the semester and made available on the college website and department notice boards. Students are informed in advance about class test dates and assignment submission deadlines. The dates and schedule of internal practical assessments are also posted on notice boards.

#### **Response:**

There are various methods to assess the outcomes. The attainment of POs and COs is the level at which students have acquired the skills and knowledge expected after completing the specific program. These are assessed through students' performance in university examinations, internal examinations, placements, prizes in sports activities, extension activities, and continuous assessment of student performance on the college campus during various programs. Attainment is accomplished through regular and continuous assessment work. Methods used for Attainment of POs and COs include internal examinations, university examinations, project work, seminars, group discussions, and student involvement in various competitions, demonstrating the knowledge and skills acquired.

Additionally, sports, curricular, co-curricular, extracurricular, cultural, NSS, and NCO programs are measures for attainment. Their placement, employment, and progression to higher education are used to assess their achievement. Attainment is done using formative assessment or conventional methods and summative assessment or non-conventional methods.

#### **Formative Assessment Method:**

COs are assessed by each department through tests, tutorials, and examinations, with results communicated to students. Student outcomes are calculated based on the results, and consolidated data from these examinations is used for an overall assessment of the COs. As part of continuous evaluation, unit tests, student seminars, group discussions, and projects are conducted. Records of these events are maintained by the concerned departments and communicated to students during regular classroom teaching. Feedback obtained from students is helpful in the teaching-learning and evaluation process to understand the learning outcomes. The university's semester pattern of examination is followed, and results from these examinations are evaluated course-wise by departments. The Principal and IQAC Coordinator discuss these results and suggest improvements in learning outcomes to the concerned department if necessary.

#### Summative Assessment:

At the end of each semester, examination results are analyzed to evaluate the outcomes. Results from these examinations are used to evaluate the outcomes, and the college maintains a result register of final year university examinations. Feedback collected from students is considered to evaluate the COs and POS. Continuous Internal Assessment of students is done during various college programs. Theory examinations, practical examinations, assignments, project work, and group discussions help in assessing

the attainment of POS and COs. Student progression to higher education and employment in various fields indicate the achievement of students.

#### **Response:**

- The College campus is spread over 2.27 acres with the total built up area of 9030.30 Sq.M.
- The college has separate building for library consisting of 99066 books and its first floor is a reading hall for students.
- The college has one girl's hostels and one boy's hostel accommodating 100 and 25 students respectively.
- The campus houses science laboratories, ICT enabled classrooms, library, NCC and NSS rooms, ladies common rooms, seminar halls, a well constructed auditorium, a conference hall and a canteen.
- Historical Musium at Department of History.
- Infrastructure for sports consists of gymnasium, sports hall and play ground.
- Classrooms, technology enabled learning spaces, seminar halls, tutorial, laboratories, botanical garden, animal house, specialized facilities and equipments for teaching, learning and research etc.
- The college has 04 UG Programmes, 15 PG programmes, 08 research centers and 27 certificate and diploma courses in emerging areas and has 1861 student strength with 123 teaching and non-teaching staff.
- The college has a well equpped language lab and smart classrooms, thus making it best place for teaching-learning.
- The college is well equipped with physical infrastructure having Principal's Office, Vice-Principal's office, IQAC, Administrative office and Ladies staff room.
- The ground has many sports facilities like basket ball, volleyball, Handball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Net Cricket.

- Apart from outdoor games college has made provision of indoor games such as Table tennis, carom, chess, Badminton etc.
- The sports facilities for students are Badminton Court 02, Table Tennis 01, Weight Lifting Set 01, Power lifting Set 01, Indoor Hall 01, Wrestling, Athletics.
- College has a well-equipped gymnasium with facilities such as Twelve Station Machine, machine exercises, free weight exercises, aerobics, zumba, massage, and a separate hall for yoga and meditation. The Computer laboratory has 20 computers, Commerce Laboratory has 17 Computers and E-Library has 20 Computers equipped with advanced software and internet. It helps pupil-teachers to develop IT skills which are necessary in today's time. In which all computers installation of antivirus and essential software.

#### Language laboratory

The Joint Director, Higher Education, Chhatrapati Sambahjinagar and the senior auditor conduct the external audit of the college regularly as per the rules and regulations of the state government of Maharashtra and submit the audit report to the college.

Grants received from various bodies like UGC, Dr. B. A.M. U., Chhatrapati Sambahjinagar are audited as per the government norms and the necessary utilization certificate is submitted. Central and State scholarships are accounted and audited. Sanctioned amount for NSS is accounted and report is sent. Alumni audit is separately audited. ## 1. Title of the practice: English Language Laboratory

## **2..Objective of the practice:**

To involve students to actively participate in language learning exercises and get more practice than the traditional classroom environment.

## 3.The context:

The language laboratory is becoming highly valued because it offers students a structured e-learning environment that is successful and reliable. The curriculum of present educational system in India does not have a laboratory session for humanities and arts subjects. A language laboratory for language learning is something new to Indian students where as it is very common in western countries. It provides students with technical tools to get the best samples of pronunciation of the language. Most of the students belong to rural area where English is not in practice for the routine communication. Students from this area must not be lagging behind, so language laboratory is the need of time. It is helpful to make students competent in communication.

## 4.The practice:

College purchased the world's recognized 'ORELL Talk' software. Teachers were trained by expert in online mode. Student accounts are opened on the server and user ID and Password are given to them. All students are permitted to join language lab according to their suitable time. Our language laboratory comprises seventeen Computers with updated Orell Talk Software. It consists of six levels of learning such as Beginners, Elementary, Pre- Intermediate, Advanced proficient and Expert. This software also consists of near about 24 modules. Through these modules students can develop speaking and learning skills. The students can open their log in accessing with password and access to course. There are certain audio and videos to be listened and exercises to be solved. Even grammar and vocabulary explanations are available. Student's login account can be accessed and assessed by the tutor. The software also records the pronunciations and answer given to questions. It improves student's pronunciation. Seventeen computers are connected with LAN and each computer has a separate head phone. So, the student can carry on his learning activity without disturbing the co-learner. Student use language laboratory in their free time. The record of their attendance is kept in register as well as their accounts are displayed on monitor. First of all we instruct the new laboratory user to use and handle the computers. The working of software and the courses are informed to the new students. It improves their knowledge and communication in English.

It also enables students-

To Practice and assess speech in a Language.

To listen to model pronunciation, repeat and record the same and do self-assessment and correction.

To learn at one's own pace.

To develop listening, reading, writing and speaking skills.

#### **5.Evidence of Success:**

Reduce the distraction in class.

Increase students' excitement and interest towards language learning.

It helps student to focus on assignment.

It creates equal opportunities for all to see and hear.

Language laboratory creates a change into the normal class routine.

#### 6.Problems encountered and resourses required:

Language lab software is sometimes costly and not affordableto colleges. If student do not have sufficient knowledge of computers then it is useless for them. In reality, student hardly finds the time to engage in the lab apart from scheduled hours, in course of study.

**Resources Required:-** Computers, Latest technology & software, Head sets, Internet facilities, Study materials etc.

#### **Best Practice-2**

1. Title of the practice: Remedial classes for slow learners

#### 2. Objectives of the practice:

- To encourage academically weaker students to improve their learning skills.
- To enhance level of understanding of basic concepts in various subjects.
- To provide a stronger base for further academic progress.
- To strengthen their knowledge skills and attitude in such subjects.

#### **3.The Context:**

Beed district is considered to be underdeveloped and backward in terms of development. Almost half of

students our college are from underprivileged society of rural areas. Due to lack of good educational institutions in rural areas, students are found to be out of mainstream of education. Also, due to poor financial situation, they have to contribute to work of their parents every day. Therefore, these students could not take proper education to strengthen their knowledge skills and academic skills. Hence the college has decided to conduct remedial classes in all subjects.

## **4.The Practice:**

At the beginning of every academic year, a test is conducted by every department to identify the academically slow learners. Beside, notice regarding conduction of remedial classes is circulated among the students who are aspiring and willing to attend the remedial classes. Once the slow learners are identified, a curriculum based on some basic concepts is designed by the head and professors of the corresponding departments. Systematic schedule is prepared for the delivery of content of remedial classes are organized during the six days of the week so as to meet the needs of the slow learners. Scheduled content of the remedial class is delivered during two months. During the course of remedial class, tests are conducted regularly to monitor progress of slow learners and at the end of remedial course; an examination is conducted to observe the progress of the slow learners.

## **5.Evidence of Success:**

Due to these remedial classes, the progress of students can be monitored and the teachers get to know weakness and strengths of the students so that teachers can plan properly for their overall development. These classes solidify basic concepts of students and they understand the main core concepts of each subject as well. This eventually resulted in progress in their final year results. Mainly, due to these classes, confidence was shown to confront any exam.

#### 6.Problems encountered and Resources Required:

To conduct these classes, the overall time table and workload of the college had to be reshuffled. Time constraint is always there to conduct these classes as it requires quite more time so as to address the different problems of the students. More ICT based content and ICT tools are required to enhance the interests of the students in the concerned subjects.

5. A well equipped commerce laboratory has been established for enlightening the commerce and non commerce students.

6. A few certificate and add-on courses have been started to introduce the local area needs. A new subject psychology is introduced in the UG program, B.Voc, degree program and three new PG programs chemistry, physics and mathematics are introduced from the academic year 2022-23.

7. The college has approached the various funding agencies like UGC, affiliating University and ICSSR for financial assistance in research.

8. The institution has constituted a research and development cell to strengthen the research facilities. Eight research centres in different subjects have been recognised as research centres by the affiliating University. INFLIBNET service under N-List facility, international reference books, library facility, wi-fi facility is provided.

9. Books and materials required for the preparation of NET and SLET exams are purchased and coaching classes have been started in the college on the regular basis for PG candidates.

10. The college has constituted a career guidance and competitive coaching cell which conducts coaching classes for various competitive examinations on a regular basis.

11. A total number of 348 research papers have been published in National and international reputed journals by the faculty of our college. 5 faculty members of our college are included in the world's scientist list.

12. All science laboratories are provided with modern equipments and instruments for the benefits of students. A chemistry laboratory is renovated with all the required modern facilities.

13. Open theatre is established in the college campus for the performance of students of drama and music and to develop the professional career of the students.
