College Implements MOPAC application and e library facility. College is involved in online Indian ranking survey like NIRF. College regularly submits online information to Director and Joint -director of higher education as per their requirement.</p> <p>Administration: In administration master soft (CMS) software has been in use since 22/06/2005. Notices and circulars are communicated to all the staff of college through Email from the</p>

office of the Principal. Each and every IQAC notice is circulated by the IQAC coordinator himself through email and Mobile SMS. College has well equipped computer lab with internet facility and necessary soft wares. The college has well equipped language laboratory with English language soft ware. The college has biometric attendance system for all the teaching and non teaching staff.

Finance and Accounts: Office and accounts section are fully computerised. All account and finance related transactions are made through RTGS/NEFT and online mode. All funding transactions' done through PFMS system according to Government. Salary of faculty members and staff of college is transferred to the bank through online mode. Monthly salary bills are submitted to Joint director office through online mode by using their soft wares.

Student admission and support: College uses MKCL/CMS software for student's admission process. Students who desire to take admission for UG and PG program of the institute are required to make online registration on college website. Then student should register for the course on university website through online mode and finally submits hard copy of application and required documents to college office. College gives computerised fees receipt to students. CMS software is used for maintaining all the record of students.

Examination: College uses MKCL software to conduct university examinations smoothly. University upload question papers of exam on college ID before 60 mins. of exam time. College generates all exam admit cards online from college id. Absent report of examination is sent daily to university through online mode on same day of exam. Exam marks entry also online mode from college id.

1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Mrs. K.S.K. College of Arts, Science & commerce is affiliated to Dr. B.A.M.U. The curriculum admission and evaluation, process are as per the rules and

regulations prescribed by the University and UGC. Faculty undertakes various initiatives, regarding curricular and co-curricular activities in college, specially devoted to encourage social cultural perspectives. Mrs. K.S.K. College provides core Graduate and post Graduate level courses that address diversity and multiculturalism. The curriculum is designed by the university to enhance students' cognition awareness of their personal value and belief. The library contributes a lot to the institution. e-Library facility is made available to the students & staff members. Near about 64 lakh 7839 e-books , 6000 e-journals, 32355 text books and 9597 reference books are available in the library which helps the students & staff to enhance their knowledge & skill to achieve their academic goals. College focuses not only on academic but also on over all development of students. Semester system is followed at UG level from the academic year 2015-2016. CBC grading system has been Introduced in all P.G. programmes as well as UG under the faculty of commerce. A wide range of subject combination is offered to students at UG level in Arts, Science and Commerce. The student has to opt three subject combinations given by the University. English is compulsory at Ist and II nd year level and second language subject has to be elected by the students. Record of teaching activity is monitored by HOD & Principal through daily diary. P.G. Director is appointed for observing and monitoring of P.G. teaching. Time table committee prepares time table of the college. The HOD of the department distributes time table among the faculties of the department. Feed back is taken from the students on Curriculum, library facility and teacher's class room performance / teaching. Feed back is analysed. Practicals are regularly conducted by the faculty members. Seven well furnished ICT halls are made available in the college. 07 LCD projectors (KYAN) are available for effective teaching learning process, Remedial classes for poor learners are engaged by various departments. Annual teaching plan is prepared by faculty. Departmental library is available for the students to get additional books. College tries its best for the development of the students. A well equipped Indoor hall is available with the facility of playing Badminton and Table- tennis. Separate consumer store is available for the students where they can get all the related documents for educational purpose like xerox copies, application forms, practical books, etc. Stationary in the consumer store is available at a reasonable price.

<p>Action Taken Report on Feedback (2018-19) Academic year (2018-19) feedback is taken from Students, Parents. Alumni, Teachers and Employers. Feedback reports are shown to the principal and necessary actions are taken. No negative feedbacks and major issues were received. Suggestions which were given by stakeholders are considered and necessary changes will be made with permission of principal. Feedback Analysis 2018-19 Various feedback are collected by the feedback committee. The analysis of the each feedback is as follows. The feedback is conducted for the improvement and suggestions from the stakeholders.</p> <p>1. Student feedback on teachers' classroom performance: Students gave their feedback on 41 teachers classroom performance. Most of the students are satisfied with classroom teaching there is negligible percentage of poor and average remarks.</p> <p>2. Students' feedback on library and campus facilities: No major issues were found facilities in the feedback about library liabilities. Students are provided with e-library facility, journals, and newspaper books and so on. Students are satisfied with the campus facilities like wash rooms, canteen, drinking water etc. Near about 135 students registered their feedback for the same.</p> <p>3. Alumni feedback about college: 130 alumni exposed their views about the college and it is found that they are fully satisfied with the improvements of the college and its campus.</p> <p>4. Parents' feedback about college: Parent community is happy with the teaching -learning and the facilities provided to their wards. 47 parents expressed their opinions for this feedback. Again, no more major negative issues are found.</p> <p>5. Feedback on syllabus by teachers: 36 teachers gave their opinions regarding the current syllabus. Eight teacher of the institution are directly involved in the process of framing syllabus at university level. Teachers are found content with the syllabus.</p> <p>6. Feedback by students about syllabus: 299 students gave their feedback on the syllabus prescribed by the university. Students did not find any objection and major problems about the syllabus.</p> <p>7. Feedback on syllabus by employers: Three employers responded to this on the syllabus prescribed to various streams. They are satisfied with the syllabus as the skill-based contents are available in the syllabus.</p>

2.3.2 – Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Student mentoring system is being implemented successfully in the college. Under the supervision of principal, student mentoring committee is formed for smooth working. Each faculty has been allotted near about 30 to 40 students for the mentoring by the committee. It helps the students to know more about college campus, the facilities provided to them by the college and also resolving their personal problems concerned with academics and also their doubts. This system helps to strengthen the teacherstudent relationship in the campus. Faculties remain in touch with the students to assist them, to help them whenever students need it. The records of the meeting with the students, the problem resolved, and their personal details are kept. The mentors are responsible for academic progress and psychological well being of their mentees. Besides, mentors also monitor the attendance and the academic progress of the students. At the beginning of every academic year, the mentors guide and inform the mentees about the institution, its goals and missions and about the infrastructure. The biographic details of each mentee are kept in the files. Moreover, mentoring system helps to decrease students' dropout rates. In this process, teacherstudent individual meeting encourages the students to feel free to ask for the help regarding the campus needs of the students. Mentors also remain in contact with the parents to counsel them with the future of the main wards. The intension of implementing this system in the institution is that it is a student oriented activity, that supports them in various ways.

The Institute has a designated officer and has appointed sufficient support staff for the overseeing the maintenance of buildings, classrooms and laboratories. Sports Complex Maintenance: Sports equipment and accessories are maintain by Sports Director of college and external agencies if applicable. Computer laboratory The laboratory has 20 computers equipped with advanced software and internet. It helps pupilteachers to develop IT skills which are necessary in today's time. Language laboratory The institute has a welleequipped language laboratory designed to improve the language proficiency of the pupilteachers. It is a fully computerized laboratory with 162 computers. The software in the computers has provision to listen, to respond, to record, to compare, and to correct. Home science laboratory This laboratory has various charts, models, microwave oven, OHP, Mixture, Laminated Charts, gas stove, utensils, cleaning accessories, spices etc. Pupilteachers learn to prepare healthy, hygienic and nutritious food in this laboratory. They learn about the various components and the nutritious values of different food items. The parent institution of the college has estate office and designated officer for monitoring the maintenance of buildings, classrooms and laboratories. A few specific initiatives undertaken to improve the physical ambience in the last five year are: ? Concreting of the parking area ? Coloring of buildings ? Changing window shutters ? LCD projectors, Kyan system, air conditioners and water coolers are maintained with the help of external agencies. ? 7.2 – Best Practices

7.2.1 – Describe at least two institutional best practices

Best Practice 1 Title of the Practice: 'Counseling and Guidance Committees for Admission Process' The Context: Admission process of any higher education institution is somewhat a critical task specially in case of online admission process. Nevertheless, if it is well planned and executed professionally then satisfaction level of prospective students increase and it also helps in branding of the institute. Here is an attempt to improve the admission process of the institute so as to make it more accessible for socially and economically deprived sections of society. Objective of the Practice: To adopt more convenient and transparent admission process by constituting 'Counseling and Guidance Committees for Admission Process'. The Practice: The college offers various certificate courses, diploma courses, undergraduate courses and postgraduate courses. The college displays an advertisement of admission process for each course in the local and regional newspapers and in the campus area well in advance. Currently a few students are against online admission process due to lack of detailed knowledge of the system and unaware of how to use it effectively. So when students approach to college, then they are helpless in most of the situations and it creates negative attitude for technology usage to simplify such critical process. To overcome such issues, a 'Counseling and Guidance Committees for Admission Process' is constituted for the better convenience of the students in assisting the online application process and also choosing the right courses and selecting desired subjects for various courses. For each given course, a separate committee is constituted and members of each committee counsel and guide almost every student who is aspired to take admission in our college. Aspired students first apply online on the college website to register their names for admission. For the online registration, College makes available a well equipped computer lab for students where staff assists the students in applying the online registration. After registration, students collect prospectus from the administrative office of the college. College prospectus provides all the required information concerning to the various certificate courses, diploma courses, undergraduate courses and post graduate courses as well as rules and regulations of the college. The college adopts 'First come first serve' policy by maintaining the reservation policy of the government for the admission process. The college has no management quota to maintain the transparency in admission process. Invalid applications are sorted out by the screening committee and the list of valid application or selected students for different courses is displayed on the college notice board. After being selected students are again assisted by the

committee members to apply online on the university website. Obstacles faced/Problems encountered: The members of the admission committee face various problems while working on the admission process. Some of the major problems faced by the institution while implementing the online problems are as under.

Computer illiteracy among the students makes them indifferent to approach online admission process. It takes much time to counsel and guide every student about the process. Rural area students find the procedure difficult and inconvenient even after the guidance by the committee. The students request the committee members to fill up the online form on their behalf. Many times slow, internet speed and data problems create hindrance in the admission process.

Impact of the Practice/ Evidence of Success College assists students from their registration to till his/her admission is completed and maintains complete transparency in admission process as a result of which college is highly appreciated by students, parents and other stakeholders of the college at large. Most importantly, students in the nearby regions preferring this college at the top for their admission. Moreover, this practice has also helped the students in getting detailed information of the college like sports, library, language laboratory, computer laboratory, activities to be run and other facilities in the college campus well in advance before their admission and eventually College marketing is also done through this practice. Resources

required: To run this practice a computer laboratory and faculty availability are required. Cooperation and support of college staff is necessary for the transparent admission process to operate. Best Practice 2 Title: Language Laboratory for the Students. Objectives: English has become the language of globe. In this era of modernization, each and every student should be able to communicate in English as it widely opens the opportunities throughout the world. The students of our college belong to rural area where English is neglected and not practiced in day not able to express themselves in English. Considering all these factors, the institution has established a well equipped language laboratory to acquire all the four language skills viz. listening, reading, writing and speaking. The laboratory helps the students to assess their own capacity of fluency and enable then to become a fluent speaker of English language. In teaching learning process, ICT plays very important role. It creates the interest among the learners. Student get attracted towards the laboratory as it has the virtual display of videos, grammar lessons, and other necessary language learning items. The principal objective of language laboratory is to enable the students to be the fluent speakers of English language and make them confident and self reliant in English communication. The

Context: English language laboratory is the prime requirement of the institution. A well equipped language laboratory needs a huge finance as it comprises a basic infrastructure, computers, headphones, software and many more things. The institution overcome all these issues and gave the preference to this practice. The first challenging issue was of the expenditure for the set up. However, by deducting other college expenses, the institution managed to set up the laboratory. The laboratory has 17 computers with head phones and the language software. The second challenging issue was of the student's

compatibility. Student are made computer friendly. It was timely appealed to the students to use the language laboratory daily in their free time. As it seemed interesting, students are coming regularly now. The Practice: English plays vital role in higher education in India. Importance of English in India is growing day by day. Now, Indian English has become its own brand on international level. It opens the wide job opportunities across the world. In

this era of globalization we cannot think without English as it is a connectivity link, library language, language of technology, as a window on a world. The place of English in India has got prime importance. But, teaching learning of English has its own problems. Lack of competent teachers, overcrowded class rooms and no English atmosphere around the learners make it difficult to acquire the four language learning skills viz. Listening Reading

-writing and speaking. In this regard, new innovations and devices are made which role among the learners. Of course, to acquire foreign language is a quiet difficult task for the learners. English is thought by following various method and approaches. Audiovisual aids in teaching learning has its unique features. Language laboratory creates interests among the learners. Our language lab comprises 17 computers with updated software consists of four level of learning. i.e. IBeginner IIIntermediate, IIIAdvance level and IVExtraordinary. The students can open their log in accessing with the password and access to the course. There are certain audio and videos to be listened and the exercises to be solved. Even grammar and vocabulary explanations are available. Student's log in account can be accessed and assessed by the tutor (teacher). Student finds it easy to operated and spend their time in this useful activity. The software also records the pronunciations and answer given to the questions. It improves student's pronunciation. So, this is one of the unique and useful activities of the department. Seventeen computers are connected with LAN and each computer has separate head phone. So, the student can carry on his learning activity without disturbing the colearning. Student use the language laboratory in their free time. The record of their attendance is kept in register as well as their accounnts are displayed on the monitor. The facility to record their exercised is one of available in the software. Overall, there is a best practice of the college. The students are from rural background and they are not energy corrupter friendly. It is a small hindrance to run this activity. First of all we instruct the new laboratory easers low to use and handle the computers. The working of software and the courses are informed to the new students. There are some challenges and contains in running this activity but, it is necessary for the overall development of the student. It improved their knowledge and communication in English. Evidence of Success: The demand of raining in linguistic skills is increasing given that learning requirement and command of language are vital in higher education. The student take part in various cocurricular activities such as wall paper presentations, speech competition etc. thought the language lab students are able to communicate themselves in various activity. Student participate in speech competition, class seminars etc. Leaning a new language just by studying the theory is not enough to
